Our activities that are available to your coordinator include: Blood Runs Cold (with LIVE Reptiles and amphibians), Forest Ecology, A Wetlands Adventure, The Great Migration (with LIVE waterfowl), Zoomin' Ziplines, Canoe Exploration, Creatures of the Woods, Team Challenge / Low Ropes Course, Birds of A Feather, Field Chemistry, Beyond the Seeing Eye (using microscopes), Climbing Wall, Spineless Wonders (with LIVE insects), Human Impact, Scarecrow and the Plow, Night Walk (walk at night with an instructor), Celestial Navigation, and CampFire.

General Camp Information

FOOD

Please do not send your child with food, chewing gum, or candy. We provide breakfast, lunch, dinner and dessert, as well as snacks during your child's stay at Camp Leopold. Food in suitcases and in the cabins will attract unwanted visitors. Food from home can cause hard feelings among the other campers and will make living conditions unhealthy for the Camp Leopold Staff and Chaperones. If your child has dietary restrictions and plans to bring food from home, please contact the Camp Leopold Director.

PHONES

During the camp stay, campers will not be permitted to make calls. CELL PHONES NEED TO BE LEFT AT HOME. We ask parents to only call the camp in an emergency situation. If your child is sick, we will notify you of your child's health status and arrangements will be made to speak to your child. Camp Leopold is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged equipment.

CAMP STORE

We have a small gift shop located in the Dining Hall that is open at the end of each program. **MONEY:** Cash, credit card, and checks are all accepted forms of payment. Available items range from \$5-\$20. Campers can buy T-shirts, Duck calls, stickers, water bottles, etc.

MEDICATIONS

School staff are responsible for managing all medication(s). Medications must be given to school staff prior to camp arrival. Students are not permitted to keep medications with them while at Camp Leopold. All medication will be stored in a locked container unless being administered by appointed school staff.

All medications must be sent in the original bottle, and include your child's name, the name of the medicine, dosage, instructions on how the medicine is taken and the prescribing doctor's name on each bottle. Please place medications and instructions in a zip lock bag with the child's name printed in bold letters on the outside. Medications will be administered at each meal time or at the time that each dosage is required.

BIRTHDAYS AT CAMP LEOPOLD

With prior notification, any camper who has a birthday while attending camp will be honored with a special birthday treat, birthday wishes, and songs from the entire camp.

Camper Expectations while at Camp Leopold

Cabin Guidelines

- 1. Rowdy, inappropriate, or reckless behavior is not permitted. Any damages will be billed to your parents and/or your school, so please be respectful of the cabins.
- 2. Keep cabins clean (flush toilets, trash in cans, keep belongings tidy under or next to your bunk).
- 3. No food or drink is allowed in cabins! We don't want to attract hungry, wild visitors to your cabin!
- 4. The cabin chaperone is in charge; students must follow their rules and direction. Schedules will be coordinated for shower times, lights out time, and thermostat controls.
- 5. You are responsible for packing up all belongings and cleanup before you leave.
- 6. Respect other students' space and personal belongings.

Camper Behavior Policy:

Our behavior policy is designed to help children develop self-control and assume responsibility for their actions.

Behavior Guidelines while at Camp Leopold:

- I will be honest and respectful (of my peers, my camp staff, and myself).
- I will follow directions and rules at camp.
- I will act appropriately towards any camper or staff member.
- I will respect the property and belongings of Camp Leopold, other campers, and staff members.
- I will use/practice appropriate conduct and language.
- I will stay within camp boundaries.
- I will do my best to HAVE FUN!!!

General Guidelines - Respect and Safety

- 1. Stay with your group and instructor at all times. If you need to leave the group at any time, remember to have an adult with you and use the 3-Person buddy system at all times.
- 2. Listen to your instructor at all times. They will make sure you stay safe and have fun!
- 3. Do not enter the maintenance sheds, kitchen, or staff lodge.
- 4. Do not run around camp. There are lots of roots, rocks and holes, so walk carefully!
- 5. Swimming is not permitted at any time! Do not go near the water's edge unless you have an adult with you or permission from the Camp Leopold Educator.
- 6. Don't spray bug spray, sunscreen, or perfume/cologne inside of any buildings.
- 7. Respect the environment. We are entering the homes of many animals and other organisms—let's act as guests in their home. Don't litter, destroy vegetation, kill or torture animals (including frogs and lizards). Please pick up any trash when you see it and turn off lights when leaving a building.
- 8. Respect others. Listen when others are talking. Use positive encouragement towards each other.
- 9. Respect the rules of the camp while you are here. If you see anything unsafe, please let an adult know right away.

Camp Leopold Packing List - What to Bring

IMPORTANT: Please check the weather before your child's visit to Camp Leopold and ensure they have appropriate clothing for the time of year. Most of our activities are outdoors, rain or shine, so proper preparation is critical in your child's enjoyment and comfort while at camp. Please come prepared with old clothes for outdoor use that you are not concerned about getting heavily soiled.

CLOTHING

- Several pairs of underwear
- Several pairs of socks
- 3-4 Short sleeve shirts
- 1-2 Long sleeves shirt
- 2-3 Shorts
- 1-2 Pairs of jeans
- 2 Sweaters/hoodies
- 1 Pair of pajamas
- Rain coat and cap (a poncho is good)
- Baseball cap/sunhat
- 2 pairs of sneakers (will get dirty)
- Mud boots/rain boots (optional)

<u>ADDITIONAL WINTER CLOTHING</u> (only for December-February field trips)

- Winter jacket
- 1-2 Additional sweaters/hoodies
- Additional socks
- Mittens/gloves
- Hat and scarf, earmuffs

PERSONAL

- Reusable water bottle
- Toiletries (soap, shampoo, conditioner, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.)
- Bath towel and washcloth
- Hairbrush/comb
- Bedding for twin-size bunk bed (Pillow, sleeping bag or fitted sheet & blankets)
- 2 plastic bags to store child's wet and dirty clothes (marked with child's name)
- Insect repellant
- Sunscreen
- Chapstick

OPTIONAL

- Inexpensive camera and film
- Sunglasses
- Flashlight
- Money for gift shop (see below)

PLEASE DO NOT BRING: Candy, gum, snacks, knives, weapons of any kind, fireworks, radios, TV's, electronic games, cell phones, or animals. Please don't bring nice clothing/shoes—only old clothes should be brought, as new clothes will be ruined by heavy outdoor use! Students are not permitted to bring their own sports equipment, and in the event they do, Camp Leopold is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged equipment.

LUGGAGE: Children will need to carry all their belongings from the bus to the cabins (about 300 yards away). Please limit luggage to just one suitcase, backpack, or duffle bag, plus one sleeping bag or bed roll. Don't bring unnecessary items. Make sure all items are marked.

Directions to the Wildlife Education Center

I-77, I-26 & I-20 traveling South or East

I-26 traveling through Columbia turn North onto I-77 I-20 traveling through Columbia turn South onto I-77

From I-77 in Columbia turn at exit #9 onto Hwy 378/76 east (Garner's Ferry Road) toward Sumter. Follow 378/76 about 25 miles to Highway 261 and turn right. Follow 261 for approximately 12 miles and turn right onto Mill Creek Road. Follow Mill Creek Road for approximately 9 miles and cross the railroad tracks in Rimini, take the right fork onto Old River Road. Travel approximately 1.5 miles and turn left at the large SCWA Wildlife Education Center sign adjacent to the large wooden and iron gates – there is a sign adjacent to them that reads "Marshall Collins Gateway."

I-95 traveling South

Exit I-95 at milepost 115 (Highway 301) and go West (right). Follow 301 to the second traffic light in the town of Summerton. Continue straight through Summerton for 4.5 miles and turn left onto St. Phillips Church Road. Travel 2.5 miles on St. Phillips Church Road to Old River Road and turn right. Travel 3.1 miles on Old River Road and turn right at large SCWA Wildlife Education Center sign right at the large wooden and iron gates – there is a sign adjacent to them that reads "Marshall Collins Gateway."

I-95 traveling North

Exit I-95 at milepost 108. Turn left on Buff Road and travel 0.8 miles to Church Street (Hwy 15/301). Turn right on Church Street and travel 0.7 miles to traffic light. Turn left on Larry King Road (Gov. Richardson Road) and travel 4.5 miles. Then turn left onto St. Phillips Church Road. Travel 2.5 miles on St Phillips Church Road to Old River Road and turn right. Travel 3.1 miles on Old River Road and turn right at large SCWA Wildlife Education Center sign Old River Road and turn right at the large wooden and iron gates – there is a sign adjacent to them that reads "Marshall Collins Gateway."

Required Camp Leopold Forms

The following are forms that need to be completed and returned to your student's teacher. While all of these forms are important, **students cannot attend Camp Leopold without having completed the "Camp Leopold Release & Permission" and "Camp Leopold Health History" forms.** Please carefully fill out and return the following forms to your student's teacher:

- o Model Release Section: This form is giving SCWA and Camp Leopold the ability to take "activity" photos of your child and use them to advertise and promote our school year camp. This section must be signed by a parent/guardian.
- o **Confidential Information:** It is very important to our staff that your child has the best experience possible while at Camp Leopold. If you're concerned about your camper experiencing an "uncomfortable situation" (ex: fear of lightning, bed wetting, picky eater, etc.), please provide us with up-to-date information that will enable the staff to be better prepared to help your child.
- o Release & Permission to Participate in Camp Activities: This form must be completed for every child attending Camp Leopold. This section acknowledges the risks associated with general camp activities and waives Camp Leopold liable from camp-related injuries. You may also choose any activities you wish to exclude your camper from while at camp.
- o **Health History Forms:** This form must be completed for every child attending Camp Leopold. (Educators will be responsible for managing, locking and administering medications for their students).
